## Board endorses flood resolution

WHEREAS the Board of Directors of the Minot area Chamber of Commerce met on March 20, 2012; and

WHEREAS the Board previously encouraged the City of Minot to move ahead resolutely and expeditiously to execute a plan that would support flood control at a level of 27,400 CFS; and

WHEREAS the Minot City Council has been presented with a plan that incorporates dikes, levees, flood walls, and diversions to provide flood control at a level of 27,400 CFS; and

WHEREAS a plan of this magnitude and scope will more than likely be modified over the nearly decade long implementation schedule; and

WHEREAS flood control for the Minot area and the Souris River Basin is key to the long term economic viability of the region;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Minot Area Chamber of Commerce urges and encourages the City Council to formally adopt that plan and begin the steps necessary to implement that plan and expeditiously secure the necessary funding.

## Rotary planting hope with seed

Help us green up the city of Minot by adopting a yard or a city park!

During the summer of 2011 Minot and the Souris River Valley was inundated by flood waters damaging 20% of the city with more than 4,100 homes and yards being damaged. The water covered so many homes that 2,376 had six to ten feet of water, and an additional 805 homes were damaged beyond repair. The flood waters that covered yards and parks for nearly a month left behind silt, sand and mud, killing the grass.

The cleanup and rebuilding process will take years for the city of Minot. Minot Rotary clubs are helping with this process by raising funds to purchase grass seed. The grass seed will be donated to homeowners and the Minot Park District so we can begin to green up the more than 4,000 yards and 300 park acres that were under water.

## Helping by the Numbers

- 1 yard requires 30 pounds of grass seed
- 30 pounds of grass seed costs \$45
- 1 acre of a park, school or city block requires 220 pounds of grass seed
- 220 pounds of grass seed costs \$330
