## TF 21 to host Strategic Triad Symposium May 3

The Minot Area Chamber of Commerce and Task Force 21 will host "Sustaining the Triad: The Enduring Requirement of Deterrence," a symposium set for May 2-3 at the Grand Hotel, invitation required.

Symposium presenters will include former U.S. ambassadors, present and former military leaders, members of North Dakota's Congressional delegation, and other experts in this international field.

Symposiums of this type are normally held in Washington, D.C., according to John MacMartin, president of the Minot Area Chamber of Commerce. Minot Air Force Base hosts both intercontinental ballistic missiles and strategic bombers, which comprise two of the three legs of the nuclear triad. The third leg of the nuclear triad is the Navy's submarine-launched ballistic missiles.

Task Force 21 is a committee whose purpose is to help preserve the missions at Minot Air Force Base. Mark Jantzer is its chairman. Jantzer said one of the things this committe has observed is a a misinterpretation of the new START (Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty).

The symposium was organized to bring together "voices who have professional creditability and who can speak to how we ought to approach this issue as a nation," said Jantzer. This past year the Minot Chamber hosted a similar successful symposium in Washington, said MacMartin.

Ron Lehman II, a former U.S. ambassador and director of the Center for Global Security Research at the Department of Energy's Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory in Livermore, Calif., is the featured presenter for the May 3 program. He has served as a U.S. chief negotiator on Strategic Offensive Arms (START I), as well as in positions in the Department of Defense and White House.

Symposium speakers include:

**Retired U.S. Air Force Lt. Gen. Frank Klotz** of Washington, D.C., senior fellow for strategic studies and arms control at the Council on Foreign Relations who is the former commander and first commander of Air Force Global Strike Command at Barksdale AFB, La. He established and then led a new 23,000-person organization that merged responsibility for all U.S. nuclear-capable bombers and land-based missiles under a single chain of command. His military career includes serving as commander of the 91st Missile Group/91st Missile Wing at Minot AFB from January 1995 to August 1996.

Lt. Gen. James Kowalski, present commander of Air Force Global Strike Command, was the first vice commander of Air Force Global Strike Command from 2009-2011. As commander of Global Strike Command, he is responsible for organizing, training, equipping and maintaining all the U.S. ICBM and nuclearcapable bomber forces.

Retired Gen. Don Alston is the former commander of 20th Air Force. As the missile numbered Air Force for Global Strike Command, 20th Air Force is responsible for maintaining and operating the Air Force's ICBM force.

Linton Brooks, a former U.S. ambassador, is an independent consultant on national security issues, senior adviser at the Center for Strategic & International Studies in Washington, D.C., a distinguished research fellow at the National Defense University, and an adviser to four of the U.S. Department of Energy national laboratories. He was the chief negotiator for START I and once headed the National Nuclear Security Adminstration.

Navy Vice Adm. Bill Burke is deputy chief of naval operations for warfare systems. Prior, he was deputy chief of naval operations for fleet readiness and logistics.

**Retired Maj. Gen. Robert Smolen** is the senior national security fellow in the Center for Global Security Research at the Department of Energy's Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory. During his Air Force career he was a Minuteman missile system crew member, instructor and evaluator with the 91st Strategic Missile Wing at Minot AFB from August 1974-January 1977.

**Robert Joseph**, a former ambassador who is originally from Williston, worked on arms control policy in both the State Department and the National Security Council during the George W. Bush presidency. After leaving the administration, he became a senior fellow at the National Institute for Public Policy. He has also served as an adviser to the Center for Security Policy.

Maj. Gen. Garrett Harencak is assistant U.S. Air Force chief of staff for Strategic Deterrence and Nuclear Integration at Air Force Headquarters in Washington, D.C. He is responsible to the Secretary and Chief of Staff of the Air Force for focus on nuclear deterrence operations. He will speak by video to symposium participants. security affairs with the American Foreign Policy Council and founder and president of his own defense consulting firm, GeoStrategic Analysis. Since 1983, Huessy has hosted more than 1,500 congressional seminars on Capitol Hill dealing with missile defense, strategic nuclear modernization, strategic airlift, strategic bombers, proliferation, arms control, homeland, port and maritime security and defense policy.

Members of **North Dakota's congressional delegation** also are expected to speak during the symposium.

About 100 people are expected to attend the symposium including representatives of the industry, civilians from Shreveport-Bossier City, La., Great Falls, Mont., and Cheyenne, Wyo., and representatives from submarine bases.

Barksdale AFB at Shreveport-Bossier City, is the only other base with B-52s besides Minot AFB's 5th Bomb Wing.

Malmstrom AFB is near Great Falls and F.E. Warren AFB is near Cheyenne, Wyo., the other two operational missile units besides Minot AFB's 91st Missile Wing.

## Are you interested in the Global Entry Program?

If you travel internationally for work or pleasure you might be interested in wanting to join the Global Entry program. Global Entry is a U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) program that allows expedited clearance for pre-approved, low-risk travelers upon arrival INTO the United States. The CBP would like to work with individuals from the Minot business community who may be interested in the program.

This program works well for those who use commercial airlines to any international travel. While this does not expedite security clearance in Minot, this will certainly expedite your clearance returning back into the United States in Minneapolis, Denver, or another large airport with customs. The TSA Pre-Check provides expedited screening through U.S. airport security checkpoints via designated screening lanes and is becoming more popular with travelers. Benefits in this program include no longer having to remove shoes, your laptop from your bag, and your belt or jacket. A simple pleasure indeed!

If you are interested in becoming a Global Entry member, please contact the Minot International Airport Administration office at 857-4724 to get on a list of interested applicants no later than May 31. Please include your email and telephone contact information.

Those interested will then be coordinated by CBP to establish a date for interview. Interviews take approximately 15 minutes. The application includes a \$100 non-refundable fee. The average processing time is approximately four to six weeks.

#### MSU percussion department sponsors concert

Minot State University percussionists will present a Spring Concert Thursday, May 2, 2013 at 7:30 p.m. in Ann Nicole Nelson Hall, Minot State University. The Percussion Ensemble, Marimba Ensemble, and Percussion Methods class will perform.

"Most of the music on the program was written fairly recently— within the past 25 years, and was composed specifically for percussion," said Percussion Instructor Avis Veikley.

Offerings range from the bombastic "Mas Fuerte" by Stephen Rush to a delicate tone poem by Marilyn Bliss, "Aurora Borealis," which uses marimba, vibraphones, metallic instruments and a "stone chime" to describe the northern lights.

Other selections represent "composed" music based on traditional folk forms, such as "Mbira" by David Hahn, inspired by the music of Zimbabwe, or "Whatcha Baion?" by Josh Gottry based on a Brazilian folk style. The Marimba Ensemble will play "Omphalo Centric Lecture" by Australian Nigel Westlake. The Percussion Methods Class will perform "Swing Low, Sweet Chariot" arranged by Ruth Jeanne. One of the more recent compositions on the program is "Bloom," Michael McIntosh's 2009 tongue-incheek depiction of a day in the life of a flower, with an accompanying electronic sound track.

Soloists featured are Suzannah Miller, performing "Marimba Dances" by Ross Edwards; and Justin Goetz, performing "Rotation 2" by Erik Sammut.

The program is free and open to the public. Parking on the MSU campus is unrestricted after 5 pm.

#### GPCCRS closing its doors

The Great Plains Center for Community Research and Service will end its operation effective April 30. GPCCRS was initially funded with a two-year congressional directed grant from the Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education, U.S. Department of Education, with the assistance of former Sen. Byron Dorgan. GPCCRS' mission was to engage Minot State University students, faculty and staff in identifying and addressing local community-related issues. The center's ongoing sustainability was based on accessing additional grant/contract funding, which due to federal cutbacks, has not materialized.

GPCCRS aided several faculty-driven projects which include Mikhail Bobylev's mold research after the 2011 Mouse River Flood; Alexey Shipunov's "Flora of North Dakota;" Bethany Andreason's Digital Minot; and Erik Anderson and Jon Rumney's Dakota Chamber Music Scholars, who brought symphonic music to schoolchildren in rural communities. GPCCRS also assisted the Minot Area Community Foundation in identifying flooded homeowners and the extent of damage through a project completed by Joseph Krieg and Guy Hanley. This effort became the foundation for the distribution of flood assistance monies.

Although of limited existence, GPCCRS fulfilled its objective of strengthening communities "while enhancing the university's distinctive mission and role by raising its educational standards and impacting student learning."
