45th Annual KMOT Ag Expo set for Jan. 27-29

The 45th Annual KMOT Ag Expo will begin Wednesday, Jan. 27 and continue through Friday, Jan. 29. The KMOT Ag Expo will be held at the State Fair Center on the ND State Fairgrounds in Minot, ND. More than 350 exhibitors will display their wares and services in more than 1000 booths. In past years, between 30,000 and 40,000 people have attended the annual show, making it one of the largest indoor agricultural shows in the upper Midwest.

Visitors can expect to see the latest in agricultural technology and equipment, along with several other exhibits that cover all areas of agriculture in western North Dakota. The show is guaranteed to have something for everyone, including informative seminars.

Don't miss an hour-long presentation by North Dakota's Ag Commissioner, Doug Goehring, on Friday, Jan. 29 at noon. The Chamber's Agribusiness Committee will sponsor this presentation.

Join area 4th graders as they learn how food gets from the farmer's fields to the grocery store shelves. ND Department of Commerce offers externship dollars to educators

Dollars are now available at the North Dakota Department of Commerce through the Educators in Industry Externship program. This program will place K-12 teachers, counselors and administrators and post-secondary instructors in a corporate work environment for a four week externship, scheduled to begin in June 2016. The externship will give classroom teachers, administrators or career counselors the opportunity to further understand the engineer-

ing design process and STEM related industries through practical work experience, which would give them the knowledge to pass on to their students, strengthening the education to industry pipeline.

The educators will earn a \$2000 stipend for completing the externship. \$1000 of that stipend will be funded through the Department of Commerce, with the employer providing a dollar for dollar match.
