Gov. Burgum to deliver State of the State Address at Minot State University

Gov. Doug Burgum announced he will deliver the 2018 State of the State Address on Jan. 23 at Minot State University. The governor will highlight the state's challenges and successes from the past year and outline his vision and agenda for the future. Dec. 15 marked the one-year anniversary of Burgum and Lt. Gov. Brent Sanford taking the oath of office.

The State of the State Address will begin

at 10 a.m. Jan. 23 in Ann Nicole Nelson Hall on the MSU campus. The Greater North Dakota Chamber is sponsoring the event, which will be livestreamed. The event is free and open to the public, but seating is limited. To register, go to the Eventbrite page <u>here</u>.

Minot's inaugural State of the City event set for Feb. 8 at Magic City Campus

The first-ever City of Minot State of the City event is now set for 2018. The inaugural event to highlight previous City activities and discuss Minot's future is scheduled for Feb. 8, 2018, at the Arvel Graving Theater at Magic City Campus.

"Minot has never held a State of the City Address, but I think this will be the beginning of an important new tradition for our community," said City Manager Tom Barry. "We want residents of Minot to have the opportunity to visit with City staff and elected officials to hear about and discuss our city's accomplishments, vision and strategy," said Barry.

The event, with the theme of "Past, Present, and Future," will offer attendees the chance to meet with City of Minot department heads and other City staff, in addition to gathering information about City projects.

- The tentative schedule for the event:
- 4:15 p.m.: Open house, featuring informational booths from City departments.
- 5 p.m.: Program begins with color guard and national anthem. City Manager Tom Barry will make introductions, followed by a speech from Mayor Chuck Barney. The winner of the fifth-grade challenge "Why I Love to Call Minot Home" will read the winning essay, and other top essays will be on display.
- 6 to 7 p.m.: Social hour featuring hors d'oeuvres from local area restaurants. "Feedback, input and guidance from our residents is vital to the success of Minot," Barry said.

Minot's Industrial Park receives certification

The Industrial Park of Minot now holds the distinction of being the first location in North Dakota to earn the BNSF Railway Company's Certified Site designation, a step that will make it that much easier for businesses interested in connecting to rail lines in Minot. The recognition of this distinction was addressed at the Minot Area Development Corporation offices by MADC president and CEO Stephanie Hoffart.

"Having this coveted designation truly shows the business opportunities and business friendly environment that is present here in Minot and opens up doors for business growth in our region," said Hoffart. "Our team has worked closely with BNSF to secure a rail spur into the Industrial Park for existing and future businesses, which was installed earlier this year. Having the BNSF Certified Site designation and the spur means that incoming businesses can cut considerable time off construction when moving here, lowering their overall costs and improving their bottom line."

According to BNSF, since the Industrial Park of Minot is a Certified Site, businesses looking to locate to Minot could save six to nine months of construction time because of this analysis. This includes an evaluation of environmental and geotechnical standards, available utilities, site availability and existing and projected infrastructure. There are only 12 other sites in the country that have earned this distinction from BNSF.

"The Industrial Park of Minot is BNSF's first Certified Site in North Dakota and strategically located at the heart of our

Great Northern corridor. BNSF's northern route serves agricultural production in the northern plains and is the gateway to the Bakken region, making Minot a perfect fit for both agricultural and industrial customers looking for direct-rail access." The Industrial Park of Minot is an 800acre park in northeast Minot with an anchor tenant in AGT Foods. 386 acres of the park is served by rail and is the portion that has been certified by BNSF as ready for the development of rail-served businesses. Along with the direct access to BNSF railway lines, the Industrial Park of Minot has convenient access to three U.S. highways, CP rail lines and is zoned



heavy industrial. Along with the Industrial Park of Minot being the first in the state to earn this distinction, the next closest BNSF Certified Site is more than 500 miles away.

Representatives who joined MADC at the announcement included Chuck Barney (Minot mayor), Tom Barry (Minot city manager), John Schneider (economic development and finance division director for the North Dakota Department of Commerce); Justin Pearson (BNSF regional manager), Minot Area Development Corporation board members, and other city leaders. The Minot Area Chamber of Commerce congratulates MADC on this important step in the development of the industrial park.

North Dakota State Fair recognized internationally for excellence

The North Dakota State Fair earned international recognition at the 127th annual International Association of Fairs and Expositions (IAFE) convention, receiving one first place award and nine other Awards of Excellence. Multiple honors were received in the agriculture, communications, and competitive categories. Fairs and exhibitions from around the world submit entries to IAFE each year, with the end goal of inspiring creativity and ingenuity. Each category being judged at the IAFE convention focuses on a different aspect of specific events and event planning.

"The IAFE Agricultural Awards contest provides fairs with a unique collaboration experience, allowing them to critique the aspects of agriculture throughout fairs, internationally," Lori Hart, director of Education and Member Services, said. The North Dakota State Fair took home one second-place finish and two thirdplace awards out of 13 categories. In the IAFE Hall of Honor Communications contest, Hart says that competitors are provided with a unique collaboration experience, allowing them to critique promotional materials in an effort to continue strengthening marketing campaigns. The North Dakota State Fair placed in five out of the 20 categories, receiving one second-place honor and four third-place awards. In the Competitive Exhibit competition, the North Dakota State Fair secured one first-place finish and one third-place award.

Renae Korslien, general manager of the ND State Fair, stated, "I am so proud of how the team at the North Dakota State Fair presents what we all love doing — making our Fair fun, safe, and always changing. Each year we continue to grow as well, with over 47,000 competitive exhibits on display in 2017. We have so much to be proud of as a Fair."
