TF 21 meets with Boeing regarding ICBMs

Minot AFB provides Strategic Deterrence to the nation, and it is a focus area for TF 21. Recently, the task force met with Boeing Company representatives in Minot, on their second visit to the Magic City in the last year. A separate, familiar division of the Boeing Company is deeply involved with the mighty B-52; these representatives were here to discuss the ICBMs.

In August of last year, the Air Force selected two companies to continue to compete to be selected to transition to the follow on ICBM system, currently known as the Ground Based Strategic Deterrent or GBSD. The Boeing representatives, Dr. Patti Dare and Andy Healy, stressed the long-term relationship with the Minot community which started in 1958 with the installation of some of the first ICBM's in the United States.

GBSD work to be done involves the entire weapon system from the missile, silo and the command and control components.

"Boeing built the Minuteman system when

awarded the contract in 1968, and Boeing is ready to repeat the process again and put a new system out in the field – a missile system that the Air Force wants and the nation needs," said Healy.

The Task Force will continue to work with the Air Force, industry partners and the ND Congressional Delegation to ensure that the Ground Based Strategic Deterrent system is fully fielded. Earlier this year, TF 21 met with representatives of Northrup Grumman, which is the other contractor picked by the Air Force to compete.

Ackerman-Estvold design donation paves the way for children's museum

The Children's Museum board in Minot announces that Ackerman-Estvold has donated the architectural and civil engineering design services for the new Magic City Discovery Center (MCDC), to be built on Minot Park District land on north hill in Minot. This investment in excess of \$200,000 from Ackerman-Estvold has allowed the project to be ahead of the curve on two key items, the pre-design work related to location selection and early design associated with the beginning stages of the MCDC Capital Campaign.

"Ackerman-Estvold is proud to be a part of bringing the Magic City Discovery Center's vision to life," said Ryan Ackerman, president/CEO of Ackerman-Estvold.

"The Board of Directors wants to thank Ackerman-Estvold and their employees for this generous gift toward the design of the Magic City Discovery Center," said Mark Lyman, president of the MCDC Board of Directors. "This wonderful donation will help us immensely in our goal of creating a children's museum in Minot, that will benefit every child in our



region and throughout the state."

The Magic City Discovery Center operated for four years as an interim museum in the Dakota Territory Air Museum facility, open only during the winter months. A capital campaign is currently underway to raise the \$7 million estimated to construct a 20,000 square-foot building, design and build 4-5 exhibit galleries of varying sizes, and set up funding for a museum endowment – along with other items.

The Minot Area Community Foundation's Bremer Impact Fund has granted \$25,000 to The Magic City Discovery Center for their Capital Campaign.

The Magic City Discovery Center (MCDC) is in the early stages of raising funds for a full-scale, permanent children's museum in Minot, located on Minot Park District land on North Hill. MCDC operated a temporary museum during the winter months out of the Dakota Territory Air Museum over the past four years. According to MCDC, receiving funds from early supporters like the MACF Bremer Impact Fund goes a long way to making a state-of-the-art,



STEAM-based children's museum a reality for the region.

"We want to thank the MACF Bremer Impact Fund for their generous support of our Capital Campaign," said MCDC Board President, Mark Lyman. "The new building overlooking Minot, from our location on North Hill, will be a beacon and source of pride for everyone in Minot and throughout the area. We will be utilizing STEAM Education (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math) to excite our children about education and motivate them to become the scientists, engineers, teachers and artists of the future."

The Bremer Impact Fund is a donor advised fund under The Minot Area Community Foundation that was established in 2007. Since then, the fund has granted over \$328,000 to 22 area nonprofit organizations in the community.

- Able to attend 90 minutes at the same time each of the 5 days of camp (15 minutes of training/daily debriefing)
- Able to provide physical, emotional and motivational support to assigned rider
- Able and willing to get some exercise (light jogging/running) for a great cause!

Dakota Hope Clinic fundraising banquet celebrates five years serving the community

Melissa Ohden was just fourteen when she learned she was a survivor of a failed

saline infusion abortion in 1977. Ohden will share her remarkable the story at 5th Anniversary Fundraising Banquet for Dakota Hope Clinic in Minot on Sept. 17, Melissa Ohden 2018 at the State Fair



Center. Doors will open at 5:30 and dinner will be served at 6:30.

Despite the initial concerns regarding Ohden's future after surviving the attempt to end her life at approximately seven months gestation, she has not only survived but thrived. With a master's degree in social work, she has worked in the fields of substance abuse, mental health, domestic violence and sexual assault counseling, and child welfare.

Ohden was formerly a college outreach speaker with Feminists for Life. She has testified before the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate and the Australian Parliament. She is on the board of directors for the Vitae Foundation, a national organization which uses media to advance a culture of life.

In 2012, Ohden founded the Abortion Survivors Network (ASN). ASN seeks to educate the public about failed abortions and survivors while providing emotional, mental and spiritual support to abortion survivors. Since ASN's inception, Ohden has been in contact with over 210 survivors.

She has been featured on television and radio programs including: The 700 Club, EWTN, Fox News, Focus on the Family, American Family Radio, the Mike Huckabee show, and the Teresa Tomeo show. She is the author of You Carried Me, A Daughter's Memoir, which was released in January of 2017.

Fulfilling the purpose that she believes God set out for her when He saved her from the certain death of the abortion attempt, Melissa is truly a voice for the voiceless.

North Dakota Women's Business Center expands services

Center for Technology & Business (CTB) was recently awarded grant funding by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) to open a second Women's Business Center, which will be located in Fargo. The new center will offer assistance, training, leadership development opportunities and other resources to women on the eastern half of the state.

"For the past 19 years, the ND WBC has served women across the state thanks to outstanding support from SBA and North Dakota Department of Commerce. The number of women who seek our services continues to grow so we are grateful and excited for this opportunity to expand our programming reach," CTB Executive Director Deb Eslinger said.

Deidre Hillman, director of the North Dakota Women's Business Center, added, "We have always been a state-wide entity, but with increasing demand for the services we provide, a second location will allow us to extend our resources and meet the needs of more women leaders, business owners and entrepreneurs across the state."

During the 2017 fiscal year, the Women's Business Center program counseled and trained nearly 150,000 entrepreneurs nationwide. According to the SBA's Office of Advocacy, there are 9.9 million women-owned businesses in the U.S. They employ more than eight million workers, provide more than \$264 billion in wages and salaries to employees, and contribute \$1.4 trillion in sales to a national economy.

North Dakota continues to be a leader in this movement by cultivating a positive, growth environment for women entrepreneurs and business owners. In fact, the ND WBC's impact was recognized nationally by the SBA when the center received the 2016 Women's Business Center of Excellence Award in the category of SBA Resource Partners. More recently, North Dakota ranked first in economic vitality for women-owned businesses in the 2017 State of Women-Owned Businesses Report, commissioned

by American Express.

Each year, the ND WBC trains approximately 2700 individuals and counsels an average of 80 entrepreneurs in business development and growth strategies. "With a second Women's Business Center, those numbers are expected to grow exponentially and we are excited to get to work," Hillman said.

Center for Technology & Business operates the North Dakota Women's Business Center, which is part of a national network of more than 100 centers that offer one-on-one business counseling, training, networking, workshops, technical assistance and mentoring to women entrepreneurs on many business development topics, including business startup, financial management, marketing and procurement. Specific ND WBC programming opportunities include, the Women's Leadership Program, the Women's Business Summit and the North Dakota Leading Ladies Luncheons.

ACCRA first quarter cost of living compares local costs to nationwide costs

Minot's cost of living is 1.7% higher than the national average for the first quarter of 2018. (U.S. Average Composite Index = 100%) The cost of living index is published by the American Chamber of Commerce Researchers Association (ACCRA). The ACCRA Cost of Living Index measures differences between areas in the cost of consumer goods and services, excluding taxes and non-consumer expenditures. It is based on 100,000 data points, for which prices are collected quarterly by the Minot Area Chamber of Commerce and 288 other urban areas across the nation.
