Northrup Grumann potential GBSD contractor

120 attend June 3 informational session

North Dakota will soon be busy with additional activity and there is a lot at stake. Two companies, Northrup Grumman and Boeing, are competing to be selected for a multibilion-dollar contract to provide the new Ground Based Strategic Deterrent (GBSD). GBSD will replace the Minuteman missile system currently deployed in 150 silos and operated by Minot Air Force Base. The program contract, once awarded, will take about ten years to complete and will have a significant impact on the greater Minot area.

On Monday, June 3, Northrop Grumman, one of the potential contractors, was in Minot to talk with Chamber members on what this contract will entail. One hundred and twenty people were on hand to learn more about the GBSD program, as well as have their questions answered. This won't be the last time for an event like this as more meetings are planned. The contract is expected to be awarded late next summer.



Burlington Colton Avenue Bridge Replacement Project breaks ground

The Souris River Joint Board (SRJB) celebrated the groundbreaking for the Mouse River Enhanced Flood Protection Project (MREFPP) Phase BU-1A Burlington Colton Avenue Bridge Replacement Project in Burlington.

Burlington Mayor Jeanine Kabanuk stated, "Though these are the first steps our community will be able to physically see, this project has been in the works since shortly after the flood in 2011. Much planning and hard work by Souris River Joint Board Officials, City of Burlington officials and staff, Ward County, the engineering teams and the contractors has gone into bringing us here today."

The project was awarded earlier this spring to Swingen Construction with the low bid of \$5,744,240. Work has begun to clear the area and relocate utilities. Colton Avenue Bridge closed May 28 and will be closed through the duration of the project. Cherry Street from Willow to Colton will also be closed.

Project details include the removal and replacement of the existing bridge. The new bridge will be raised and lengthened to create better conveyance. A minor realignment of Cherry Street and grade adjustments to Colton Avenue are also included in this phase.


