Merger talks continue MADC and Chamber boards discuss merging agencies

The Minot Area Chamber of Commerce and the MADC Board of Directors have each agreed to move ahead with looking into the possibility of merging. In February, the groups heard from Bismarck/Mandan Chamber EDC Director Brian Ritter on what was involved for their two organizations to combine. After that talk, the two boards agreed to pursue the idea to weigh the pros and cons for the Minot entities.

A committee will be organized to represent MADC and the Minot Chamber to move for-

ward. The process will entail looking at assets, bylaws, boards, staff and more. Any member with questions regarding this process is encouraged to call the Chamber/MADC and visit with Minot Area Chamber of Commerce President and acting MADC President John MacMartin about their questions and or concerns. In addition, you can also reach out to the volunteer board members of each organization.

Barksdale Award is in Minot for next two years

The HIRE Vets Medallion Program is an employer recognition program administered by the Department of Labor's Veterans' Employment and Training Service (VETS). Through the program, VETS accepts voluntary applications from employers for the HIRE Vets Medallion Award beginning Jan. 31 of each calendar year. The award recognizes employers who hire and retain veterans, including their efforts to establish employee development programs and veteran specific benefits to improve retention.

The City of Minot encourages all residents to fill out and return the census form immediately. This census is the first in history to allow people to participate via telephone and internet. If you do not self-respond by the end of April, a census bureau employee will visit your place of residence to obtain your census information during the month of May. Please remember that all census data is confidential and can only be used to produce statistics. Your personal information will not be released until the year 2092. 

MAFB 2019 Economic Impact statement released

The 2019 MAFB Economic Impact has been released and shows the steady impact Minot Air Force Base has made to our area. On February 6, during the Military Affairs Committee meeting, the 5th Bomb Wing Comptroller budget office detailed the 2019 economic impact report. It shows that there are 12,041 personnel living on base, and the total economic impact is \$559,390,411.

While Minot Air Force Base provides an economic boon to our area and the state, it's the people that make it outstanding. Minot is home to the 5th Bomb Wing and 91st Missile Wing and the community is proud of that! Minot Air Force Base brings so much to the City of Minot — the people there support the community by volunteering whenever needed, by bringing diversity to the community, and the economic impact keeps the community's economy strong. Candidates must also submit a statement of interest and a certificate of nomination. All information should be filed with the City Clerk's office.

City of Minot positions on the June ballot are three seats on the City Council currently held by Josh Wolsky, Shannon Straight, and Stephan Podrygula.

Broadway Bridge project wins award

The Broadway Bridge replacement project was recently named the 2019 Gold Star winner for excellence in concrete in the bridge category at the Ready Mix & Concrete Products Association's annual convention.


The City of Minot, in conjunction with the North Dakota Department of Transportation, replaced the aging bridge structure, which was built in 1962 and expanded to two lanes of northbound and two lanes of southbound traffic in 1971. Lunda Construction was the general contractor, with Strata Corporation as the concrete supplier. Strata also performed the concrete work for the new roadway. The project engineering firms were Burns & McDonnell and Bartlett & West.

"The Broadway Bridge runs through the heart of our city, and is vital to the everyday lives of our community's residents," said Minot City Engineer Lance Meyer.

The bridge was built in two phases over two years. Approximately 8,500 cubic yards of concrete were produced for the project. The project included incorporating a portion of flood wall that is being constructed as part of the Mouse River Enhanced Flood Protection Plan. The new structure is 86 feet wide with a length of 822 feet. The bridge carries approximately 30,000 vehicles daily.

The 2021 Ready Mix & Concrete Products Association annual convention is scheduled to be held in Minot.

Representatives from Verendrye Electric Cooperative and Central Power Electric Cooperative hosted a dedication and ribbon cutting of the new 115 kV (115,000 volt) transmission line from southwest Minot to east Ruthville. The dedication/ribbon cutting was held at the Dakota Boys & Girls Ranch in Bremer Hall. Senator John Hoeven attended and spoke about this new infrastructure serving the region. This new \$20 million plus transmission line project provides a 115 kV transmission loop around Minot and provides another source to the bulk delivery substation that services Minot Air Force Base. It will also provide capacity for the Minot area and western Ward County for years to come.

Citizen's Academy accepting applications for participants

The Minot Police Department is accepting applications for the 2020 Citizens Academy, scheduled from 6 to 9 p.m. on Tuesday evenings May 5 - 26.

The purpose of the Academy is to invite members of the pubic for a hands-on, behind the scenes, look at how the Minot Police Department serves the community. The Academy's structure encourages participants to ask the "tough questions" and facilitates open discussions on the challenges facing law enforcement today.

Course content includes instruction in the areas of patrol operations, crime scene response unit, special operations (SWAT, K9, bomb squad), use of force, and familiarization. weapons Academy instructors have a wide range of law enforcement training and experience and enjoy the opportunity to not only show

what it is they do, but why they perform duties the way they do. Each participant is also invited to join a patrol officer for a ride-along to see first-hand the duties and responsibilities of municipal law enforcement officers.

Applicants must be 18 years old to apply and must also consent to a background check. This does NOT mean that people with some negative history with law enforcement or the judicial system are automatically disgualified. All interested area residents are encouraged to apply. Grants awarded for marimba quartet residency April 23-25

Minot Public Schools, the Minot Symphony Association and Minot State University Division of Music have received grants from three arts organizations in support of an April 23-25 residency at MSU of the Iowa-based Heartland Marimba Quartet. The cooperative project includes a workshop for middle school and high school student percussionists, a free public recital, and a concerto performance with the Minot Symphony Orchestra.

Minot Public Schools applied for and was awarded a \$1250 Special Project grant from the ND Council on the Arts. The project as a whole has been granted \$1000 from the Arts Midwest Touring Fund and \$650 from the Percussive Arts Society. Additional support will be provided by the MSU Division of Music through its Northwest International Festival of Music. Other co-sponsors of the event are the Magi Drum Line and MSU Percussive Arts Club.

The Heartland Marimba Quartet (HMQ), headquartered in Waterloo, IA, was established in 2016 and is comprised of founder Matthew Coley plus Michael J. Jones, Joe Millea, and Ujjal Bhattacharyya. The group's mission is to

develop and disseminate the classical marimba art form in both academic and community contexts. Their appearance in Minot is one stop in a spring 2020 concert tour through Wisconsin, North Dakota, Minnesota, and Iowa.

A HMQ workshop and performance at MSU on April 24 will be part of the official 2020 Percussive Arts Society ND Day of Percussion. On Saturday, April 25, HMQ will be featured guest soloists with the Minot Symphony Orchestra, performing the "Marahuaka" marimba concerto by maestro Efraín Amaya and "Journey for Marimba" by Coley. The ND Council on the Arts (NDCA) receives funding from the state legislature and the National Endowment for the Arts in support of local arts funding. Established in 1961 as a non-profit, music service organization, its mission is to inspire, educate, and support percussionists and drummers throughout the world. Through the activities of local chapters, PAS encourages each state to hold an annual Day of Percussion.

Cooperatives celebrate new \$20 million transmission line

Electric cooperatives are celebrating an infrastructure investment of more than \$20 million that improves electric reliability to Minot, the Air Force Base and rural areas.

Central Power Electric Cooperative recently completed a 115,000-volt transmission line that is 26.8 miles long. It starts southwest of Minot at a bulk delivery substation, heads north and then connects to a substation east of Ruthville. Verendrye Electric Cooperative, a distribution cooperative, uses the line to serve the area. Central Power is a wholesale power supply and transmission cooperative owned by Verendrye Electric and five other cooperatives.

A ribbon cutting ceremony was held Feb. 19 at the Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch in Bremer Hall. Sen. John Hoeven spoke about how the project benefits the region. The project was financed with loans from the Rural Utilities Service, a federal agency under the USDA.

This provides a 115-kV transmission loop around Minot and brings another source to the bulk delivery substation that services the Minot Air Force Base. This major infrastructure project will provide electrical capacity for the western and northern Minot/Ward County region for years to come.

Funds have been included in the 2017-2019 budget to help expand the coalition's work and fund its future initiatives. One of its goals is to partner with many businesses in North Dakota to ensure those who have served, their families, and survivors receive the care and assistance they need.

FAA grant will fund taxiway, apron work at Minot International Airport

The Minot International Airport has been awarded a grant of more than \$2 million from the Federal Aviation Administration to help with the final phase of taxiway and apron construction projects.

The project includes the reconstruction and expansion of the cargo apron and a portion of the taxiway that provides access to that area east of the passenger terminal. The apron was originally built in 1953 with updates in 1987.

Airport Director Rick Feltner said the taxiway and apron need to be replaced, as

their condition has deteriorated. The latest pavement condition index rated the area at 26 out of 100. The area is adjacent to the recently constructed Fed Ex facility and needs to be expanded to accommodate increases in cargo processing and the size of cargo aircraft.

Feltner said the project is anticipated to go to bid in April, with construction starting soon after the bidding process is complete. The project's expected cost of \$3.36 million will be shared between the FAA (90%), the State Aeronautics Commission (5%) and the City of Minot (5%).
