Minot's cost of living is just under the annual national average for the 2020 Annual Average. (U.S. Average Composite Index = 100%) The cost of living index is published by the American Chamber of Commerce Researchers Association (ACCRA).

The ACCRA Cost of Living Index measures differences between areas in the cost of consumer goods and services, excluding taxes and non-consumer expenditures. It is based on 100,000 data points, for which prices are collected quarterly by the Minot Area Chamber EDC and 288 other urban areas across the nation.

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LOGISTICS PARK OF NORTH DAKOTA LEGISLATIVE UPDATE SB 2245 HOUSE AMENDMENT

The Intermodal Transportation Assistance Program is an appropriation to the North Dakota Department of Agriculture for support of intermodal service in North Dakota.

The proposed funds of \$2.5 million must be used for providing grants to an organization dedicated to development of an intermodal transportation facility and expansion of intermodal infrastructure in the state.

The expansion of intermodal site infrastructure into BNSF Railway's Gavin Yard needs to take place by August 1, 2021. It is estimated this expansion could cost up to \$3.1 million. Minot Area Chamber EDC is negotiating with all parties to complete the expansion as quickly and economically as possible. The Intermodal Assistance Program would provide funding to ensure the project can be completed.

TWO PHASES OF FLOOD PROTECTION PROJECT WIN NATIONAL AWARD

The largest infrastructure project in Minot's history has earned national recognition.

Phase 2 and Phase 3 of the Mouse River Enhanced Flood Protection Plan received the 2020 Crown Communities Award from American City & County, a national organization dedicated to recognizing public projects and servants. Projects are judged on uniqueness, short- and long-term value to the community, and effective and innovative financing.

"These two phases are vital parts of the overall \$1.028 billion project to protect the City of Minot and the entire Mouse River Basin," said Dan Jonasson, director of Public Works for the City of Minot and a director for the Souris River Joint Board. "These phases are great examples of what can be accomplished when federal, state, and local entities work together to find solutions for funding, permitting, construction, and maintenance."

The City of Minot collaborates with many partners on the overall project, including the Souris River Joint Board, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Federal Emergency Management Administration, the North Dakota State Water Commission, the Minot Park District, and the Ward County Water Board, as well as elected officials at the local, state, and federal levels.

Work on Phases 2-3 began in May 2018 and was completed in October 2020 at a cost of \$40 million. The projects included more than 8,900 feet of earthen levees, a removable road closure, multiple levee ramps, interior drainage pump stations, and 1,600 feet of stream bank restoration.

MINOT AREA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION GRANTS \$250,000 TO ROOSEVELT PARK ZOO

The Minot Area Community Foundation (MACF) is excited to announce a grant awarded to The Roosevelt Park Zoo's Amur leopard habitat in the amount \$250,000.

The Roosevelt Park Zoo (RPZ) is North Dakota's oldest zoo. After enduring two major flood events in 1969 and 2011,

an effort was launched in 2017 to dramatically improve the quality of the zoo with new exhibits for the big cats. The first phase of the New Habitat for a New Century opened in September of 2019 with the African Lion Savanna and was quickly followed by the Amur Tiger River Valley in June of 2020.

The Amur leopard habitat, which is phase 2 of this effort, will work to help save the world's most endangered big cat from extinction. There are currently only about 85 Amur leopards left in the wild. Through breeding efforts designed into this new habitat, RPZ has the opportunity to participate in an international effort to save this animal from extinction.



"The Amur leopard habitat will create a modern, natural and dynamic living environment for the animals; a space that will inspire a connection between our guests and the Amur leopards; a space that meets a new habitat standard we as a community have set together." says Jennifer Kleen, GMZS Executive Director. "By investing in the quality of life for the animals in our care, MACF is also improving the quality of life for our community."

The \$250,000 grant from The Minot Area Community Foundation is made possible by The Mike & Dorothy Dolan Fund and The Arnold I. Besserud Fund and will go towards the east and west Leopard Mountains.




