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JURY RULES IN FAVOR OF CITY IN DOWNTOWN PARKING STRUCTURE LAWSUIT

A North Central District Court jury ruled in the City of Minot's favor in a dispute with Cypress Development, LLC involving a publicprivate partnership project that included the development, design, and construction of two downtown parking structures. The jury's decision came after more than a week of testimony before North Central District Court Judge Gary Lee.


"We're glad to have this issue behind us after investing so much time, money, and emotion into these structures," said Minot Mayor Shaun Sipma. "Now we can focus on moving forward for the benefit of the City."

The City's relationship with Cypress began in 2011, when the City selected Cypress for a



The City terminated its contracts with Cypress and filed suit for breach of contract in March 2018. At trial, the jury awarded the City \$2,442,479.94. Those amounts included unpaid rent and excess costs the City incurred constructing the parking structures. They also include costs incurred by the City to install the exterior walls and roofs on the two structures, which were the obligation of Cypress but were completed by the City. The City has managed and operated the structures since March 2018. Cypress' countersuit, which was denied by the jury in its entirety, sought more than \$50 million in damages related to excess construction costs and lost profits.

Sipma said efforts will begin to find a partner to construct apartments on top of the two structures and complete the development of the existing commercial space. "We appreciate the hard work done throughout this lengthy process by Jocelyn Knoll and Kate Johnson from the Dorsey & Whitney law firm, who represented the City in Court, as well as the City Attorney's office and current and former City staff," Sipma said. "We presented a strong case to the jury, and we're happy they agreed with us."

RESILIENT HOMEBUYER PROGRAM HELPS 50TH PARTICIPANT PURCHASE A HOME

The City of Minot's Resilient Homebuyer Program reached a milestone today by assisting its 50th participant to buy a home in Minot.

The Resilient Homebuyer Program is funded through the National Disaster Resilience Competition, a grant awarded to the City of Minot in 2016 by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). This grant, one of only 13 awarded nationally, has helped the City become more resilient and has assisted in the recovery for residents impacted by the 2011 flood. The Resilient Homebuyer Program helps eligible buyers whose homes were destroyed or significantly damaged by the 2011 flood purchase a qualified home in a resilient neighborhood.

"The Resilient Homebuyer Program made it significantly more attainable for me to purchase a home in Minot, the city where I grew up. It is important to me to be able to stay close to my family in the Minot area and be part of the future of this community," said Alex Gorze, the 50th buyer.



The Resilient Homebuyer Program provides qualified buyers an opportunity to receive a NDR GAP loan that can be forgiven after 15 years of owning the home, subject to certain requirements. The City of Minot is working with the North Dakota Housing Finance Agency to manage the NDR GAP loan underwriting, as well as finalize buyer eligibility.

"This program has been a tremendous success," Minot Mayor Shaun Sipma said. "It has helped people whose homes were damaged or destroyed by the flood buy a home and continue to be part of our community. The City Council is pleased to have played a role in this process, and we continue to be supportive of the program."

"We are pleased with the results we are seeing with this program. More families are qualifying and purchasing homes that they might not have been able to buy without this assistance. As a result, the community of Minot continues to strengthen its tax base and retain residents," said Resilience Program Manager John Zakian. "This program has helped the City of Minot become more resilient and provide home ownership opportunities for some residents impacted by the flood, which is an important goal of the NDR program."

The primary qualification requirements for the Resilient Homebuyer Program are:

- Buyer's household income must be at or below the current low-and-moderate income limits based on the family size for Ward County
- Homes must be located within the City of Minot, within a designated resilience area, and outside of FEMA's proposed 100-year flood plain.
- The purchase price of the home may not exceed the current maximum price reviewed annually by NDHFA, which is \$311,979.
- The property must pass a HUD Housing Quality Standards inspection to be eligible for the program.
- Buyers must secure a 30-year fixed rate first mortgage from a participating lender.
- Buyers must complete and secure a certificate of completion from an approved Homebuyer Education course.

NORSK HØSTFEST PLANNING FOR 2022

Norsk Høstfest is moving ahead with plans for the 2022 festival under the leadership of a new board of directors and president.

Tim Mihalick has been named the new board president, taking over for David Reiten who retired this spring. Mihalick says the new board is receiving guidance from a Minneapolis-based festival consultant to devise the best path forward. First, the US/Canadian border remains largely closed, shutting off a large portion of Høstfest's traditional audience. In addition, planning for a large festival such as Høstfest requires a long lead time and the uncertainty surrounding the pandemic has made it impossible to make required arrangements in time to finalize this year's event.

Mihalick stresses that he and the new board are fully engaged and have confidence Norsk Høstfest will be held in September of 2022, re-starting a tradition that has been a big part of North Dakota for over 40 years. Exact dates of the 2022 festival will be announced in the coming months.



NDDOH RECOGNIZES WORLD BREASTFEEDING WEEK AND THE ROLE BUSINESSES PLAY IN SUPPORTING BREASTFEEDING MOMS

During World Breastfeeding Week, August 1 through 7, the North Dakota Department of Health (NDDoH) is calling on businesses to learn how they can help support an employee's decision to breastfeed.

In 2019, over 80% of North Dakota babies began their lives being breastfed. Breastfeeding has health benefits for both baby and mom, and can protect against many illnesses and infections, meaning fewer absences from work. Unfortunately, research from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) shows breastfeeding rates significantly decrease when mothers return to work, with only about half still breastfeeding after three months.

Returning to work and continuing to breastfeed can be challenging for many mothers, causing them to discontinue breastfeeding. A Kids Count Data report from 2019 indicated mothers of young children represent 76% of North Dakota's workforce, which puts businesses in a unique position to help promote and support breastfeeding.

"Making accommodations for your employees to feel comfortable during this short time in their lives builds trust and loyalty between the employee and company," says Janna Curry, human resources manager for West Acres Development in Fargo.

To ensure a supportive environment for new mothers in her workplace, Curry helped her company become designated as an Infant Friendly Workplace through the NDDoH. This designation is awarded to businesses that adopt breastfeeding support policies allowing new mothers to privately and comfortably pump breastmilk during the workday.

"It's an important way for companies to show they care about their employees' personal lives, especially something as life-changing and exciting as a new baby," says Curry.

The first step toward becoming an Infant Friendly Workplace is to establish your workplace breastfeeding policy. The policy should include guidelines for adequate break time; a clean, private location for milk expression; and resources for clean water and breast milk storage.
